The Brief Psychiatric Rating Scale (BPRS) is a rating scale which a clinician or researcher may use to measure psychiatric symptoms such as depression, anxiety, hallucinations and unusual behaviour. Each symptom is rated 1-7 and depending on the version between a total of 18-24 symptoms are scored.

The Brief Psychiatric Rating Scale for Children was created to provide a concise profile of childhood behavioral and emotional symptomatology (Hughes et al, 2001; Overall & Pfefferbaum, 1982). The BPRS-C-21 was devised through the factor analysis of a large sample of items addressing important psychiatric symptoms in children.
