Provide Clear Discharge Instructions All instructions for care at home, including medications, diet, therapy, and follow-up appointments, must be explained in detail to all patients and then presented in written form to take home upon discharge. Exact dates and times of follow-up appointments need to be included.

Discharge Instructions for Coronary Angioplasty and Stenting During your angioplasty, a doctor inserts a thin tube called a catheter into a blood vessel in your groin or wrist. The catheter is guided through your blood vessel to a blocked area in one of your heart's arteries.

Discharge Instructions for Coronary Angioplasty and Stenting

EGD is done with an endoscope. This is a flexible tube with a camera at the end. During the procedure: You received medicine into a vein (IV).; The scope was inserted through the esophagus (food pipe) to the stomach and first part of the small intestine ().Air was put through the endoscope to make it easier for the doctor to see.

Uro-Lift Discharge Instructions: Voiding after the procedure: You should be able to void after the catheter has been removed. Typically, there is symptom relief as early as two weeks after the procedure. It is common to have urgency, frequency and feeling the need to void often. Sometimes there is burning. This should resolve day-by-day, week ...

Policies and Procedures for Outpatient Surgery

Nurses must dedicate time for assessments and discharge teaching. Effective patient teaching requires uninterrupted blocks of time. To support this, post signs outside the patient's room to indicate a "do not disturb zone." Patient assignments may be handed off so that the nurse can give the patient his or her undivided attention.
