Stick to simple keys and rhythms. The majority of country songs are written in the most common major keys (G, A, C, D, E, and F) and use straightforward rhythms. Start off by trying to write the song in a common key and a 4/4 time signature (the beat lasts about 1 second long and there are 4 beats per measure).

Finally, in terms of arrangement, most hit songs follow a similar overall structure. They: start with a short intro, have a couple sections of verse /chorus (and possibly a pre-chorus), have a departure section (like a bridge), climax with the highest amount of energy (usually a chorus), and then end with an outro.

Write a catchy hook or chorus. This is the repeated phrase in the middle of the song, separating each verse. They are not strictly necessary (see A\$AP Rocky's "One Train"), but almost any rap song that wants to gain radio play or traction needs a good catchy hook.

Rough out a lyric based on the hit song structure above. Write a first verse lyric that introduces listeners to the singer or the situation. End your verse on a line that leads the listener into your chorus. Use your most emotional or strongest lyric line to start your chorus.

Many of today's biggest hits rely on a song structure like this: Verse / Chorus / Verse / Chorus / Bridge / Chorus. Some add a short section called a "pre-chorus" or "lift" between the verse and chorus to build anticipation.

You could write down exactly what you want to get across in your lyrics, then play about with the rhythm, structure and cadence of your words to fit them around your melody.
