Social Justice and Ethics is an interdisciplinary course which draws from theology, ethics, philosophy, the social sciences, and from the humanities. The course introduces students to theories, methods, issues and theologies of Social Justice and Ethics Studies in relation to a) the social and moral teachings of different religions of the world, and b) concrete issues such as peace-building, war, violence, social, political, economic, and criminal justice.
