Marriage: November 22, 1813. Catherine's parents were Robert COBB and Catherine of Halifax Co., VA. 1828-1838: Family home was in the name of Catherine Cobb, Catherine Condley and Anderson Condley- along Bradley Creek, N. side of Banister River, W. of Terrible Creek. March 1829 sold to William PRINGLE.
