The Korean language (South Korean: **한국어** / **조선어** hanguk-eo; North Korean: **조선말** / **한국말** chosŏn-mal) is an East Asian language spoken by about 77 million people. It is a member of the Koreanic language family and is the official and national language of both Koreas: North Korea and South Korea, with different standardized official forms used in each country.

The relationship between Korean and other languages is not known for sure, though some linguists believe it to be a member of the Altaic family of languages.

The Korean language borrowed some Chinese words beginning with a liquid ([l] in Chinese), and Koreans tried to pronounce them with an r, but they were generally successful only when the element was not initial in a word; when the liquid was initial they used an n instead.
